"READ!"

Edgar Allan Poe (1809-1849)

Poe **is known** as one of the fathers of the detective story. Apart from writing detective fiction, he **was** also a short story writer, poet and literary critic.

He **was born** in Boston, but he hardly **had** a happy childhood. His parents **were** travelling actors and they **died** before he was two. Poe **was brought up** by the Allans. They **disagreed** with many things young Poe **did** and **were** disappointed when he **left** his studies at the University of Virginia. Poe **started** to publish quite early. In 1827 his first book **came out**, anonymously and at his own expense. It **was** a collection of poems, Tamerlane and Other Poems. He **entered** West Point, the famous school for soldiers, but he **had to leave** for "neglect of duty". He **was** certainly **not** fit to be a soldier, which **displeased** Mr. Allan.

Poe **started** to write short stories for magazines to earn a little money. At that time he **moved** to Baltimore to live with his aunt and to marry his cousin, Virginia, who **was** only 13 at the time. He still **worked** for magazines, also as a literary critic.

Poe **was** ambitious and his poem The Raven **made** him well known. However, he **was** almost always poor and throughout his life he **suffered** from similar problems as the characters of his stories, nervous disorder and alcoholism. He **drank** a lot and **had** fits of madness.

Many famous writers, including Wilde and Baudelaire, **admired** his stories, e.g. The Black Cat, The Pit and the Pendulum, The Tell-Tale Heart, The Golden Bug, and many others.

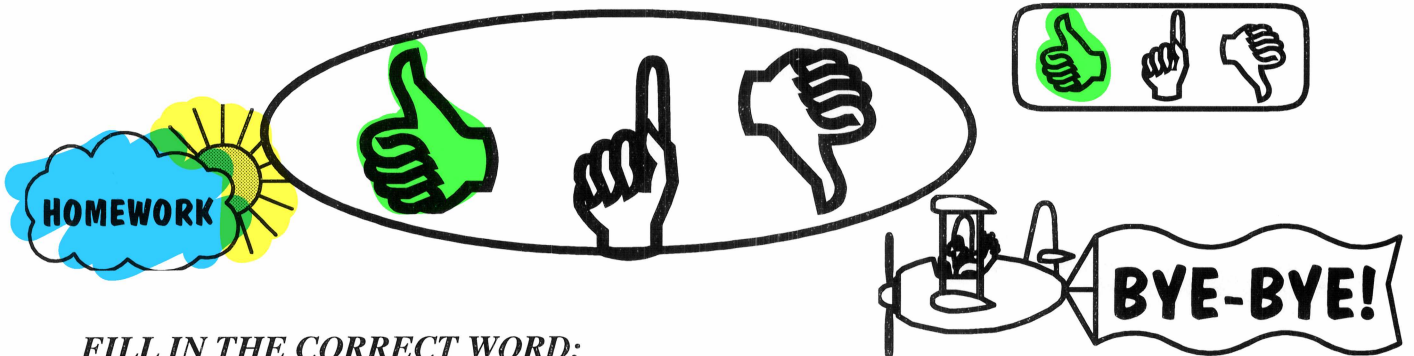

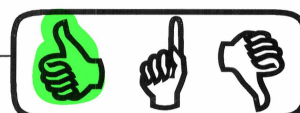
